Restoring degraded landscapes isn't just about planting trees or conserving water. It's about regenerating communities — and that starts with empowering women.

In Kabirdham, Chhattisgarh, where rural women are the backbone of agriculture and forest-based livelihoods, their participation is crucial to sustaining long-term ecological and social change. Yet, many remain excluded from decision-making, economic opportunities, or even basic education.

This project integrates gender transformation at the heart of landscape restoration — ensuring women are not just beneficiaries, but co-creators of environmental solutions.

What Are We Proposing?

Since 2022, Chhattisgarh Agricon Samiti (CAS) has been working in Kabirdham as part of the **CHiRP coalition**, with partner such as **Commonland Foundation**, **PRADAN** and **UNICEF**. Our ongoing initiatives include bridging education for out-of-school women and girls in partnership with **Educate Girls**, and a five-year holistic landscape restoration plan with Commonland Foundation. Within this, the Women's Empowerment and Gender Transformation component ensures inclusive restoration by building spaces, skills, and support systems for rural women to lead.

Why Kabirdham?

Kabirdham district in Chhattisgarh presents an opportunity for transformative change. Despite progress in development indicators, the district faces persistent gender gaps:

- Limited women's participation in local governance and decisionmaking.
- High burden of unpaid care work and social restrictions on mobility.
- Low engagement of men and boys in gender conversations.
- Deeply embedded social and gender norms that reinforce inequality and limit women's agency.

Existing working team of CAS & community structures (PRIs, FPOs, youth networks) provide a strong foundation for embedding gendertransformative practices.

Reach 10.000+ women and girls across 260+ villages in Kabirdham

Train 200+ local facilitators and FLWs in aendersensitive practices

Increase Women Participation in Community run Enterprises.

Increase female participation in landscape activities by 60%
